Worship

Worship is the heart of Peace Memorial Presbyterian's common life. Called into being by our crucified and risen Lord, Jesus Christ, we come each Sunday to praise God. In worship, we acknowledge God's presence and work in our lives as we pray, read Scripture, hear the Word preached, sing hymns and offer ourselves in thanksgiving for Christ's redemptive action and God's continuing claim on our lives. Worship is led by our Pastor, the Rev. Dr. M. Rebecca (Becky) Burton. Like many other Christian churches, we follow the Common Lectionary, which means we read through most of the Hebrew Scriptures and New Testament in a three year cycle. We utilize the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible and the Presbyterian Hymnal. During the year, we involve our youth in leading worship on Youth Sundays, celebrate our Scottish and Reformed heritage with the annual Kirkin' of the Tartans, and All Saints Day. Special services include Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday as well as healing and wholeness services.

Music

Music ministry honors God through inspiring sacred music provided by the soaring notes of the mighty Casavant organ, the Chancel Choir, Children's choir, and Youth Praise Band. In addition, we



often are privileged to have special music from Florida Orchestra members and other talented musicians. Outreach involves sharing our musical heritage with the community through the *Peace Memorial Concert series* monthly, October through April.

Fellowship

Peace Memorial Presbyterian Church offers many opportunities for fun and fellowship. Our Fellowship Council organizes Sunday morning coffee hour, special receptions, lunches, and dinners, in addition to our regular Wednesday evening dinner.



We have a strong and vital group in our *Presbyterian Women of Peace Memorial* who are committed to support the mission of the church locally and worldwide. Membership is divided into small groups called Circles that meet once a month to provide an inclusive, caring community of women. All circles have a Christ-centered bible study conducted by a Bible Moderator. Circle membership often results in close friendships and loving support in time of need.

Fellowship opportunities include: Movie Nights, Chili Cook-Off, Spring Fling/Hawaiian Luau, Pool Party and Picnic, Octoberfest, Christmas Progressive Dinner, Winter Resident's Group, Annual Art Show, Jazz Sunday, and Kirkin' O The Tartans

Service

The church is called to share the love of Jesus Christ with others. We encourage each to offer his/her time and talent by serving through our many ministries to others: the Child Development Center (serving pre-kindergarten aged children); the Cold Weather Shelter (serving homeless persons in the winter); Religious Community Services Food Bank; Isaiah's Inn; Beth-el Farm Workers' Ministry, and the mission work of the Presbyterian Women. In addition, our councils often need assistance including Worship, Property, Education, Evangelism, Finance and Stewardship.

Opportunities



History

Peace Memorial is blessed with a rich and colorful history closely aligned with the history of Clearwater. A group of 17 original charter members, whose faith brought them together in 1891, organized our church as Clearwater Presbyterian Church. It was renamed First Presbyterian Church of Clearwater, known around town as the “little white church”.



Today’s pink stucco Mediterranean Revival style church is enhanced by over seventy awe-inspiring stained glass windows. The north and south transept windows are originals by stained glass designer Louis Comfort Tiffany and signed by him.

The Casavant pipe organ has over 3,000 pipes. The smallest is the size of a pencil; the largest is 32 feet tall. Built in 1975, its tonal design encompasses the traditional sounds of the Baroque organ of 17th century Germany and the Romantic organ of 19th Century France.

A unique feature of the instrument is the Trumpet En Chamade, mounted over the choir loft.



The four manual console is equipped with a memory system allowing for over one hundred pre-set registrations.

Christian Growth

Committed to helping people to grow in their Christian journey, we offer ongoing and special classes.

Adult Sunday school classes begin at 9:15a.m. with three classes: *Journeys in Faith*, led by Elder Brooks Workman and Rev. Kathi Trautwein, discuss contemporary faith issues. *The Marshall Class*, led by Elders Cliff Williams, Martha Jane Moores and Frank Wolling study Scripture and its relevance.



Parents’ With Children is a new class led by Dr. Becky that explores what it means to be a Christian today. In addition, Dr. Burton teaches a 4 week class once a quarter for those exploring *What it means to be a Presbyterian*.

Wednesdays begin with an “early bird” Bible study at 7 am led by Dr. Burton, which studies a variety of topics relevant to our faith, ranging from particular books of the Bible to Reformed theology books. Then, on Wednesday evenings, the *Agape Connection* offers 4 week spiritual development classes and special interest classes. Classes are led by our pastor, Dr. Burton, as well as other experienced teachers.

Youth: An active middle through high school group meets each Sunday to explore how God is working in their lives. They also gather on Wednesday evenings for fellowship and study, go on retreats, lock-ins, and serve those in need.

Children’s Sunday School: each Sunday following the Children’s Message in worship. It is led by committed lay teachers and utilize our Presbyterian based curriculum.
