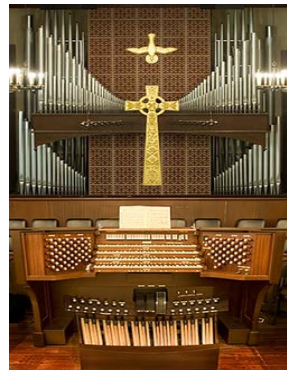


## Peace Memorial Music Series Statement of Purpose
